## 1.) Complete an Annual Risk Assessment

#### 2.) Upgrade Physical Security Measures

Make sure that walkways around campus are well-lit at night to deter crime and help students feel safer. They also improve exterior video surveillance. Use an access control system to keep track of who is entering and exiting buildings, and ensure that only authorized personnel have access to secured areas.

## 4.) Create Relationships Between Campus Security & Students



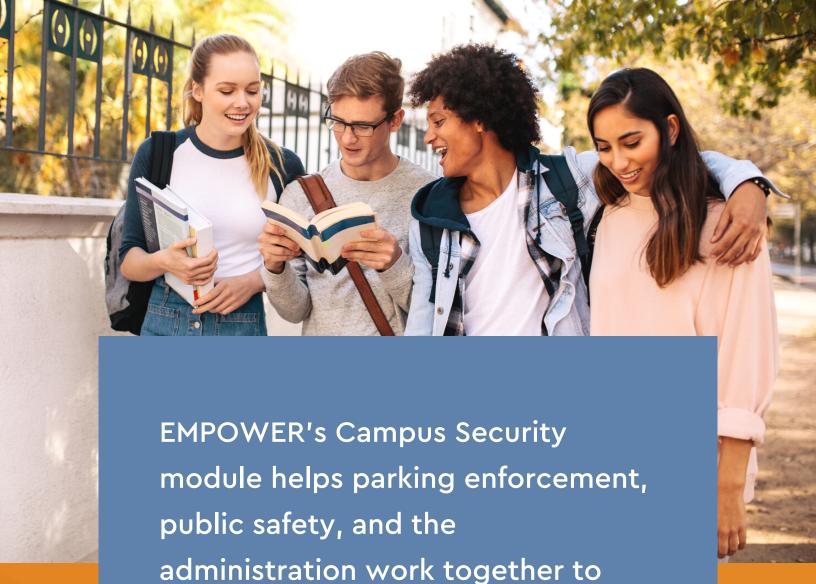
It's important that students are able to trust their security staff, and feel they can reach out for help.
